Connecting People - Sharing Knowledge - Enabling Life-Long Learning


#### **OUR CULTURE**

### Vespasian Warner Public Library District Boundaries

The VWPLD serves nearly 11,000 patrons in central DeWitt County. We work to have a variety of materials and services available to best meet our patrons' varying needs. Services include:

- 40,000+ items for check out
- Interlibrary-loan, giving our patrons access to millions of items
- New-release best sellers, popular movies, and a growing collection of videogames
- A robust local-history collection
- E-books and e-audiobooks on four different platforms
- Six public-access computers and free Wi-Fi
- Notary service
- Technology help
- Information services in person, by phone, or online
- Programs, classes, and events
- Delivery for home-bound patrons
- Meeting and study rooms

#### THE THIRD SPACE

After a decline during and coming out of the COVID-19 Pandemic, our circulation, across the board, is increasing.

#### **23/24 INCREASED VISITORS**

More people visited the library in FY 23/24 than in any year since 2019.

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### WHAT'S NEW

#### LUNA

For the first time in many years, we have a library pet! Luna the Bearded Dragon has settled in nicely and been a huge hit.





#### **MORE E-SERVICES**

We added Kanopy for video streaming and CloudLibrary for ebooks, to give our patrons even more options.

#### **MORE PROGRAMS**

We've expanded the number of programs we offer, and have a greater variety for patrons to choose from, including adult fitness, teen gaming, and family parties.

We're always excited to try something new and patron response has been overwhelmingly positive.



### WHAT'S NEW

#### **MEMORY LAB**

Patrons can now digitize and preserve their family memories with our Memory Lab! The lab includes equipment to digitize VHS, Super 8, audio cassettes, slides, and more.





#### **MORE PARTNERSHIPS**

We are actively working to expand and strengthen relationships with partner organizations, such as 4H and Celebrate Clinton for programs and community projects.

#### **MORE HISTORY**

As of June 2023, we have digitized more than 1,200 local history items, plus more than 100 years of DeWitt County newspapers, making our shared history easily accessible.


